










Dr. P.H. Bryce: The man who knew better





Dr. Peter Henderson Bryce

Report on the Indian Schools of Manitoba and the Northwest Territories which is commonly known as The Bryce Report.

"Suffice it to say that of the 1537 pupils reported upon, 25% are dead of one school with an absolutely accurate statement 69% of ex pupils are dead... Dr. Bryce's description of the schools shows them to be veritable hotbeds for the propagation and spread of this disease."

SCHOOLS AID

Startling Death Rolls Revealed.

AMONG INDIANS

Absolute Inattention To Bare Necessities of Health.

In his report upon the Indian boardwest, Dr. P. H. Bryce, chief medica officer of the Indian department, emphusizes the absolute necessity for greater care in the selection of pupils and for sanitary precautings in the choole to prevent the spread of disare. During his recent tour of inspection Dr. Bryce instructed the principals of all the echouls to report to Ottawa direct upon the past history and present condition of the health of the children, who have been pupils at the

Summarising the stat stical statement thus obtained Dr. Bryce rays, after aligning to the defective records of the schools: "It suffices for us to know however, that of a total of 1,527 pupils reported upon, nearly 26 per cent. are dwid, of one school with an absolutely securate statement, 69 per cent of expupils are dead, and that everywhere the almost invariable cause of death given is tuberculosis."

Dr. Bryce's description of the schools shows, them to be veritable botheds or the propagation and spread of this disease. In fact, in only one school which the medical inspector visited was attention paid to the most ordinary requirements of ventilation of the dormi-

The total school attendance in Indian schools of every class was 2,691 last year. Only about 51 per cent. of Indian children between the ages of seven and envertieer attend school, and the attendance, at the industrial schools is decreasing.



Duncan Campbell Scott, Superintendent of Indian Affairs

Cost to implement Dr. PH Bryce's reforms: \$10,000 to \$15,000

Duncan Campbell Scott's reaction to Dr. PH Bryce's report: Reforms too expensive and not implemented.

In 1920, Scott made attendance at residential schools for all children aged 7–15 mandatory.



1895

Duncan Campbell Scott requests a warrant to remove "Indian" children from their homes for "educational" purposes.

1922

Dr. P.H. Bryce publishes the book,
"The Story of a National Crime"
outlining the failure of the federal
government to act.

1996

RCAP finds that the majority population of child welfare cases are Indigenous.

2007

Jordan's Principle passes in the House of Commons: Equity in public services for all First Nations kids.

2008

The Prime Minister, on behalf of the Government of Canada, offers an apology for the residential school system.

2014

Canadian Human Rights Tribunal (CHRT) hears from 25 witnesses, including 7 federal government officials, over 72 days.

CHRT rules that the Government of Canada is discriminating against 165,000 First Nations kids

1907

Dr. P.H. Bryce's report to federal government: children in residential schools are dying; deaths are preventable.

1967

Caldwell Report: 80% of residential school students are child welfare cases; recommends investing more in First Nation family support services.

2000

Government commissions Joint National Policy Review: First Nations kids receive 78 cents on the dollar for child welfare compared to non-Indigenous children.

2007

The Assembly of First Nations (AFN) and the Caring Society files human rights complaint against the federal government.

2013

Documents obtained by Access to
Information confirm inadequate child
welfare funding and its critical impact on
First Nations children.

2015

The Truth and Reconciliation
Commission releases its 94 Calls to
Action to redress the legacy of residential
schools and advance reconciliation.
Includes calls to redress child welfare
and implement Jordan's Principle.

Key barrier to reconciliation:

Not doing better when we know better.



Spirit Bear Plan

End Inequalities in Public Services for First Nations Children, Youth and Families

First Nations children and families living on reserve and in the Terrisories receive public services funded by the federal government. Since confederation, these services have fallen significantly short of what other Canadians receive. This injustice needs to end and Spirit Bear's Plan will do just that.

Spirit Bear calls on:

CANADA to immediately comply with all rulings by the Canadian Human Rights Tribunal ordering it to immediately cease its discriminatory funding of First Nations child and family services. The orders further require Canada to fully and properly implement Jordan's Principle (www.jordansprinciple.ca).

PARLIAMENT to ask the Parliamentary Budget Officer to publicly cost out the shortfalls in all federally funded public services provided to First Nations children, youth and families (education, health, water, child welfare, etc.) and propose solutions to fix it.

GOVERNMENT to consult with First Nations to co-create a holistic Spirit Bear Plan to end all of the inequalities (with dates and confirmed investments) in a short period of time sensitive to children's best interests, development and distinct community needs.

GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS providing services to First Nations children and families to undergo a thorough and independent 360° evaluation to identify any ongoing discriminatory ideologies, policies or practices and address them. These evaluations must be publicly available.

5 ALL PUBLIC SERVANTS, including those at a senior level, to receive mandatory training to identify and address government ideology, policies and practices that fetter the implementation of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's Calls to Action.
